

## **Facilitating Novel Teaching and Learning: ICT Challenges and Opportunities at the University of South Africa**

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**ABSTRACT** The advent of the introduction of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) at higher education institutions in Africa has brought new meanings to globalisation of education and the building of new technological savvy campuses. New learning methods are advocating innovative levels of learning and teaching. This paper identifies challenges of introducing and utilising ICT at the University of South Africa (UNISA).
