ABSTRACT Recent development on cloning techniques and on human stem cells research have been followed by some attempts to provide a legal framework for these practices. In Europe, both the Council of Europe and the European Union have approved some initiatives. But is at a national level where these regulations are more relevant. European experience shows a wide range of approaches, from the permissive one of the United Kingdom, to the repressive one of Germany.
