

A Note on Some Morphogenetic Variable Among The Mishings of Assam

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ABSTRACT Morphogenetical traits such as pattern of hand clasping, arm folding, handedness, dominant eye, tongue rolling, earlobe attachment as well as dental occlusion pattern of the Mishings of Assam are reported. Barring tongue rolling, the two sexes fail to record any statistically significant differences in the remaining characters. The results of the present study are compared with other neighbouring population in order to assess the group differences or similarities. The present Mishing sample stand significantly apart from most of the population under consideration.
