

A Study of Hair Whorl on Occiput of Bodo Kachari of Kokrajahr in Assam, India

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ABSTRACT The head hair whorls among the Bodo Kacharis of Kokrajhar district in Assam has been studied. The results show that the clockwise whorl dominate over anticlockwise whorl and single whorl is more common as compared to double whorl in both males and females. A comparison is made with tribes and castes of North-East India and Bodo Kacharis show intermediate position among groups with Mongoloid and Caucasoid affinities.
