

Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) in Rural and Marginalized Area: Evaluation and Impact

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ABSTRACT By introducing Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs), online learning has taken another dimension. It has also become a significant teaching and learning resource base. This study aimed at investigating the use of MOOCs in rural and marginalized areas.
